International association for Gondwana Research Annual Convention and 9th international symposium on Gondwana to Asia–Adelaide 2012

The 2012 Annual Convention of the International Association for Gondwana Research and 9th international symposium on Gondwana will be held in Adelaide during November 18–20, 2012.

The School of Earth and Environmental Sciences, The Centre for Tectonics Resources and Exploration and the International Association for Gondwana Research, invite you to participate in this important international gathering of geoscientists interested in the various aspect of Gondwana and other supercontinents.

The conference will run for two days on November 19th and 20th, 2012 at the University of Adelaide with a welcome reception on Sunday, the 18th of November. We are planning a one/two day pre-conference field trip examining Cambrian arc initiation on the Gondwana margin and a four day post-conference trip to the Southern Gawler Craton.

Adelaide is situated on the edge of Gondwana and is a beautiful city with plentiful accommodation options to suit all budgets. November is late spring in Adelaide and the weather should be sunny and dry with temperatures in the 20's to low 30's centigrade – perfect for fieldwork and discussing the geology of Gondwana in one of the many Mediterranean-style bars that characterise the downtown area of the city.

The conference will address a wide range of topics related to Gondwana and will especially focus on:

- Gondwana Resources
- Gondwana Amalgamation

- Gondwana Break-up and the Amalgamation of Asia

Registration is free, but there will be a charge for the conference dinner and for the fieldtrip (to be announced in due course). Abstracts would comprise both oral and poster presentations and must be submitted before July 30, 2012. Abstracts should follow the format of “Gondwana Research” (<http://www.elsevier.com/locate/gr>) and can be up to three printed pages with a maximum of one figure and one table. The abstract volume will be published as a Conference Series volume of the IAGR.
